Historical: Kathy has nothing new to report, but still needs ride pictures.

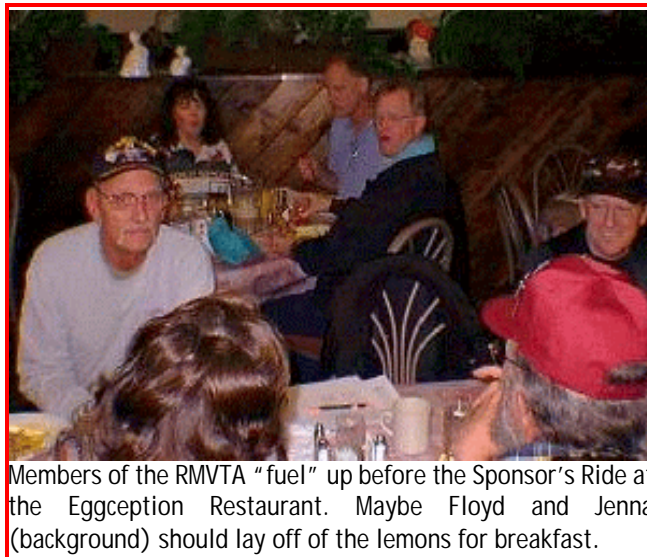
Member Relations: Jerry and Linda report that they had the calling list ready, but Jerry forgot to bring it! (I definitely see a pattern here).

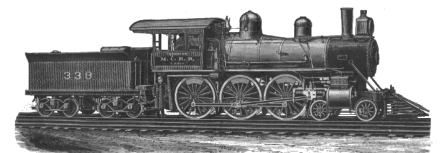
