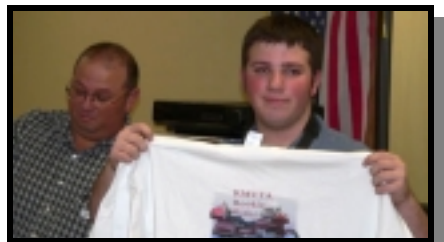

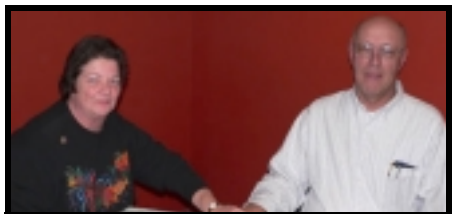

Spotlight on Members

Jerry and Linda Hatfield "Rag Top" and "Lady Blue"

Jerry is originally from Bartlesville, Oklahoma. When I asked him if he grew up in Bartlesville Jerry responded, "I grew up west of the Mississippi, my dad had itchy feet." While he was growing up he lived in Oklahoma, Oregon, California, Utah, Kansas and then Colorado. Jerry moved to Colorado in 1953 and attended Sheridan Union High School. He ended up graduating from North High School in 1957. Jerry was married to his first wife, Gloria until she passed away in November 1997 from cancer. He had three children from that marriage. His oldest son, Terry, committed suicide at the age of 32 years old. His son, Tom, age 43, lives in Nebraska and has four daughters. Tom enjoys riding motorcycles and owns two Yamaha motorcycles. Tom just bought a 1978 Goldwing that he is really enjoying. Two of Tom's daughter's got married this past summer in Nebraska. They had a double wedding. The two sisters ended up marrying two brothers. Jerry's daughter, Tammy, age 41, is single living here in Colorado. Jerry is a retired salesman. He worked for Barta Sales. Barta sales sold vending products and he met Jerry and Linda Beach through his work. They owned a vending machine business and they would buy vending products through him at Barta Sales.

Linda grew up in Lodi, Ohio which is 38 miles south of Cleveland. She married Jerry Beach in Ohio. They moved to

Colorado in 1977 working for a vending machine company. In 1982 Jerry and Linda Beach started their own vending business. Linda and Jerry Beach had two children together. Their daughter, Kelly, is 34 years old and Paul is 32 years old. They both live in Colorado. Paul has a son, Cody, who is 11 years old. Jerry and Linda Beach became members of RMVTA in 1994. Jerry Beach had his Harley made into a trike. Jerry Beach died of cancer in November 1995 three years before Gloria died. Linda remained a member of RMVTA and she learned to ride the trike.

Jerry Hatfield and Linda Beach have known each other since the early 1980s. Their life together began around 3 months after Gloria died. They had both been invited to a surprise birthday party for a friend, Tom. Linda called Jerry and asked him if he was going to the birthday party. He told her that he was and she said, "good, pick me up." Linda hung up the phone. Of course being the upstanding gentleman he is he picked Linda up for the party (of course thinking, this is all I need a widow who just wants to get married). A short time later he helped her install some shutters and they began dating. Feeling good after a few months of dating Jerry asked Linda to marry him. Linda's reply was, "hell no." (I guess Jerry had to re-evaluate why Linda was dating him) A few months later the dating is going well and Jerry asks Linda again if she will marry him. Her reply this time is just, "no." Jerry then tells Linda that he is done asking... it will have to be up to her now. Well months later as Jerry was driving Linda states, "how does a June wedding sound?" 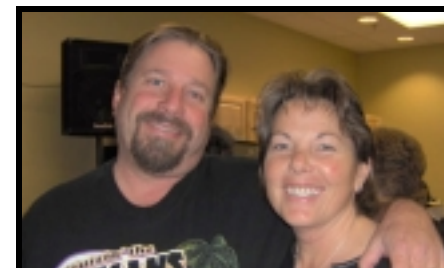
